PARTICIPATION IN EDUCATION AND TRAINING BY 16 AND 17 YEAR OLDS IN EACH LOCAL AREA IN ENGLAND: 2002 AND 2003

INTRODUCTION

1 This Statistical First Release (SFR) updates the local estimates of participation in education and training by 16 and 17 year olds published on 27 February 2004 (Statistical Bulletin 01/2004). It provides figures for end 2002 and provisional estimates for end 2003 by Local Education Authority (LEA), local Learning and Skills Council (LSC) area and government office (GO) region. The release of the provisional estimates for the first time brings forward the publication of the local level end 2003 data by nine months. This publication also contains a revised historic time series for participation, back to 1994. Local estimates supersede all previously released.

2 National figures on participation in education, training and employment of 16 to 18 year olds in England are published annually in a separate SFR. The latest was SFR 03/2005 published on 27 January 2005. The figures in SFR 03/2005 are the definitive national figures. Figures presented here cover participation in education and LSC funded Work-based Learning (WBL) only; figures in the national-level SFR also include participation in Employer Funded Training and Other Education and Training. For other differences between the national-level SFR figures and those given here, see section E in the Notes to Editors.

3 Additional tables providing more detailed breakdowns, and the full time series back to 1985, will be available on the website.



KEY POINTS

4 The key points to be drawn from the estimates published in this SFR are given below.

Government Office Region (Table 1; Charts A and B)

- Participation in full-time education and LSC funded work-based learning (WBL) at end 2003 separately show greater regional variation than when combined. Full-time education participation rates were generally higher in the South than in the North, with the reverse pattern for participation in LSC funded WBL.
- The proportion of 16 year olds who continued in full-time education in school was higher in the South than in the North, while the opposite was true for the proportion going on to sixth form or other further education colleges.
- Participation by 16 year old females in full-time education was between 7 and 11 percentage points higher than males for all regions. For participation in education and LSC funded WBL, the gender gap was lower, with female participation between 2 and 8 percentage points higher than males. Similar differences are seen for 17 year olds.

Learning and Skills Council (LSC) areas (Table 2)

- At end 2003, participation in full-time education by local LSC area ranged from 64 per cent to 82 per cent for 16 year olds; and from 51 per cent to 71 per cent for 17 year olds. The local LSCs with the highest rates were in the South.
- Participation in education and LSC funded WBL combined was more uniform throughout the country than full-time education and WBL on their own, as local LSCs in the North with low rates in full-time education had high rates in WBL and in other part-time education. Participation in education and LSC funded WBL for 16 year olds ranged from 78 per cent in Birmingham and Solihull to 90 per cent in North Yorkshire. For 17 year olds, participation ranged from 68 per cent in Norfolk to 83 per cent in Berkshire.

Local Education Authority (LEA) (Tables 2, 3a and 3b)

- Participation in full-time education of 16 year olds at end 2003 ranged from 59 per cent in Barnsley to 89 per cent in Richmond-upon-Thames. For 17 year olds, participation in full-time education ranged from 44 per cent in Salford to 79 per cent in Harrow and Richmond-upon-Thames.
- Table 3 gives a time series for participation in full-time education, showing that around half of all LEAs have seen a 5 percentage point change in their rates over the decade, and around a quarter have seen over a 10 percentage point change.
- Participation in education and LSC funded WBL for 16 year olds at LEA level was more consistent across the country than participation in full-time education, ranging from 73 per cent in Barnsley to 93 per cent in Enfield, Redbridge, Richmond-upon-Thames, and Waltham Forest. For 17 year olds participation in education and LSC-funded WBL ranged from 55 per cent in Thurrock to 100 per cent¹ in Wokingham.

NOTES TO EDITORS

5 The estimates of participation in education and training combine data from a number of sources, with procedures to identify young people in more than one form of provision, to give a view of the cohort as a whole.

6 The definitions used to produce the local level participation estimates are mainly the same as those used to produce the national level estimates. The differences are highlighted in the text and are presented in the box at section E.

A. DEFINITIONS

Academic Age

7 The age of a learner is measured at the beginning of the academic year, 31 August.

Reference Dates

8 The population, schools and work based learning (WBL) data described as end 2003 relate to January 2004; Further Education Institution (FEI) data relate to November 2003; and Higher Education Institution (HEI) data relate to December 2003. The end 2002 figures for the different data sources similarly refer to the same months.

9 The figures for end 2003 are provisional, all other figures are final and supersede all previously released. Final end 2003 estimates will be published in the next edition of this publication - alongside provisional estimates for end 2004 - due to be released in early 2006.

10 More recent data has been used for the end 2002 and end 2003 participation estimates than that used to produce the national level estimates, which may lead to some differences between the two publications. Sources are presented more fully under section B.

Education

11 The definition of full-time education varies according to institution type:

Schools: a full-time pupil is someone studying 10 sessions a week, where a session is 1/2 day. Prior to 2002, all pupils were recorded as full-time;

FEIs: full-time full-year learners are defined as those enrolled on programmes of at least 450 guided learning hours per year, or for at least 150 guided learning hours per tri-annual period or more than 16 guided learning hours per week for shorter courses. Full-time learners who are not classified as full-time full-year are classified as other full-time. See www.lsc.gov.uk for more information;

HEIs: full-time full-year students are defined as those studying 21 hours a week for 24 weeks. Full-time students who are not classified as full-time full-year are classified as other full-time. See www.hesa.ac.uk for more information.

12 Figures exclude learners studying overseas, and learners from overseas studying in FEIs and HEIs in England, as opposed to the national level participation estimates, where learners in FEIs from outside the UK are included.

13 Young people studying a FE course in addition to taking part in WBL in the same FEI, are included in both full-time education and WBL, but are also reported separately as the overlap group and are only counted once in the totals. Those doing WBL in FEIs are in the WBL information only.

Government Supported Work Based Learning for Young People (WBL)

14 WBL for young people comprises of Advanced Apprenticeships, Apprenticeships, Entry to Employment (E2E), and NVQ Learning. Since 26 March 2001, WBL has been funded through the Learning and Skills Council (LSC).

Labour market information

15 Local labour market data (i.e. the local Labour Force Survey (LFS)) are not currently available on a consistent basis to be used in this publication. As a result, local estimates are also not available for young people in Employer Funded Training (EFT) or in Other Education and Training (OET), as information on these young people is collected in the labour market data.

Numerators and denominators of participation rates

16 The numerators for participation in education and training are the sum of the five elements as follows.

- a. the number of full-time maintained school pupils *resident* in the LEA/local LSC area wherever studying;
- b. the number of pupils *attending* independent schools in the LEA/local LSC area;
- c. the number of full-time students (studying further education courses in FEIs or HEIs) *resident* in the LEA/local LSC area wherever studying;
- d. the number of young people on WBL, according to the LEA/local LSC area where they are *resident*. Trainees who are also in full-time education are included in both WBL and full-time education figures but counted once only in totals;
- e. the number of students on part-time further education courses (in FEIs or HEIs), who are not on WBL, *resident* in the LEA/local LSC area wherever studying. These will include students supported by an employer or doing personal study.

17 The denominators are estimates of the resident population in each LEA/local LSC area in January of each year. The breakdown into academic years of age is calculated from mid-year estimates provided by the Office for National Statistics.

18 Due to the margin of error surrounding local level population estimates (as set out in Section B) and the use of school level data for independent schools, **participation rates at LEA level can be over 100 per cent**. For these LEAs, an asterisk is placed in the tables.

Regions and boundaries

LEAs

19 Participation estimates for individual **Inner London LEAs** are not given due to the high level of cross-boundary flows of independent school students between the LEAs. The introduction of pupil level schools data for maintained schools has not enabled the publication of participation rates for Inner London LEAs as independent schools still return school level data. See section B for further information about Pupil Level Annual Schools Census (PLASC) data.

Local LSC areas

20 Local LSC areas have the same boundaries as single LEAs or small groups of LEAs. Participation rates for LEAs and local LSC areas with similar names are not necessarily the same because the geographical areas covered may not be identical.

B. DATA SOURCES

Box A: Data Sources

Schools	<p>The Schools' Census provides data on school pupils in January of each year.</p> <p>For end 2001 onwards, the LEA area for pupils in maintained schools, city technology colleges (CTCs), Academies and special schools has been identified using the postcode of the pupils' home addresses. For the pupils whose postcodes are missing, the LEA of school has been used instead.</p> <p>Pupils in independent schools and pupil referral units (PRUs) are treated as if they live in the LEA in which their school is situated. This will lead to inaccuracies in participation rates by residence to some degree, as some pupils attend independent schools outside their LEA/local LSC area.</p> <p>Prior to end 2001, location information for all school pupils was collected by the LEA in which their school was situated. Therefore, there is a break in the time series at end 2001.</p> <p>All schools data are final.</p>
FE Institutions	<p>The Learning and Skills Council's Individualised Student/Learner Record (ISR/ILR) provides data on learners in FE sector colleges. Snapshot data as at 1 November has been used.</p> <p>In the ISR/ILR the LEA has been identified using the either the current postcode, or the postcode from which the learner applied to the FEI. For the learners whose postcodes are missing the LEA of institution has been used instead. This applies to less than 0.2 per cent for the ILR as at end 2003.</p> <p>The ILR data for 2003/04 was 99% complete for 16 and 17 year olds. The missing 1% of record has been added by "backfilling" with 2002/03 ILR data to enable local level estimates to be produced. Data for all other years are final.</p>
HE Institutions	<p>Students in institutions of higher education on 1 December are included from data supplied by the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA).</p> <p>The LEA has been identified using the postcode of the address from which the student applied to the HEI. Where this data is not available, the LEA of the institution has been used instead.</p> <p>All HEI data are final.</p>
WBL	<p>For end 2001 onwards, the Learning and Skills Council's ILR provides data on learners on WBL programmes. Snapshot data as at 1 January has been used.</p> <p>In the ILR the LEA has been identified using the either the current postcode, or the postcode from which the learner applied. For the learners whose postcodes are missing the LEA of the provider has been used instead. This applies to about 1 per cent for the ILR as at end 2003.</p> <p>Prior to end 2001, WBL information was provided by the Training and Enterprise Council (TEC). Due to incomplete data, WBL figures are not available at LEA level before end 1997.</p>
Population estimates	<p>The population estimates for academic year ages in January of each year are derived by DfES from mid-year estimates provided by the Office for National Statistics. At local level, for individual ages, such estimates are subject to some uncertainty. This is particularly the case in small areas, where the margin of error surrounding a population estimate can be disproportionately high. Users should bear this in mind when making comparisons, for example year-on-year within a small area or between one small area and another.</p> <p>The population estimates have been revised and are discussed in paragraphs 24-25.</p>

C. CHANGES TO DATA SOURCES AFFECTING THIS AND FUTURE PUBLICATIONS

21 All historic data was quality assured prior to this publication and this led to some small changes in the information from schools, FE and HE institutions. As a result, some of the differences in the figures when compared with those previously released will be due to both this process and the revisions to the population estimates.

FEI data

22 The FEI information for 1994 to 2000 has been changed since it was last published in December 2002. Those students who were solely studying courses for a WBL programme have been removed, as they were also included within the WBL figures for those years.

HEI data

23 In previous publications, 16 and 17 year olds in HEIs who were studying courses at HE level were not included. Figures for all years have been revised to include this small number of young people in the publication.

Population data

24 ONS revised population estimates in 2004 and the latest information is used in this release – population estimates published by ONS on 9 September 2004 (revisions to population estimates for 2001 to 2003) and on 7 October 2004 (historic population estimates 1991-2001). These incorporate the revisions to various local areas following the investigation of post-Census population figures.

25 A detailed investigation into the local level post-Census population estimates has been carried out prior to publication. The analysis adequately explained the changes and so estimates are published for all areas as planned.

D. CHANGES TO THE TABLES

26 The following changes have been made to the layout of the tables published in this SFR in endeavour to provide the relevant information for our customers. Please see the “Further Information” section for contacts to provide any comments or feedback on these changes, or suggestions for further improvements.

- Table 1: the old table 1 and 4 combined. Provides regional level estimates of participation, by gender.
- Table 2: this replaces the old tables 2-6. Provides local LSC and LEA level estimates of participation for 16 and 17 year olds.
- Table 3a and 3b: new tables. These provide estimates of participation in full-time education by 16 and 17 year olds by LEA for 1994 onwards.

27 Additional tables will be placed on the website. These will include tables containing estimates for 16 and 17 year olds combined; and time series information for each of the different sub-national areas.

E. COMPARISONS WITH OTHER PARTICIPATION DATA

National SFR

28 National data on participation of young people in education and training are published annually in a Statistical First Release 'Participation in education, training and employment by 16-18 year olds in England'. The latest is SFR 03/2005.

29 Participation rates may not coincide exactly with the SFR. The differences between the two publications are set out in the following box:

Box B: Differences between National and Local level participation estimates	
The national SFR contains participation estimates for 16-18 year olds.	The local SFR does not contain participation estimates for 18 year olds. The information collected HESA on students in HEIs in the UK does not hold the term-time address of the students, and therefore can not be used accurately for local level analysis of participation by the LEA that a young person resides in. As the majority of 18 year olds in education are at an HEI, this means that we can not produce participation estimates for 18 year olds at a local level.
The national SFR estimates for young people in Employer Funded Training (EFT) and Other Education and Training (OET).	The local SFR does not contain estimates for EFT and OET participation. The participation estimates are produced as a snapshot of participation at the end of the calendar year. Information on EFT and OET participation is derived from the Labour Force Survey (LFS). Local LFS data is only available on a whole-year basis.
The national SFR estimates contain information on the employment status of young people	The local SFR does not contain labour market information. Labour market data is taken from the LFS, and therefore is not used at a local level for the reasons given above.
The national SFR estimates contain all young people in FEIs.	The local SFR contains those 16 and 17 year olds studying in FEIs, who apply from the UK. It does not include those from overseas.

Connexions

30 Another source of local participation rates is data from the Management Information Systems for the Connexions Partnership areas (equivalent to LSC areas). These are published as 'Moving On - Pathways Taken by Young People Beyond 16', and are available via the Connexions website (www.connexions.gov.uk/partnerships) under Publications.

31 The Connexions data has different definitions from those used in this publication. In particular, young people in education are included in the Partnership area in which they attend school, rather than where they are resident. However, the Connexions publications do include labour market information.

Chart A: Participation of 16 year olds in education and WBL by region, end 2003

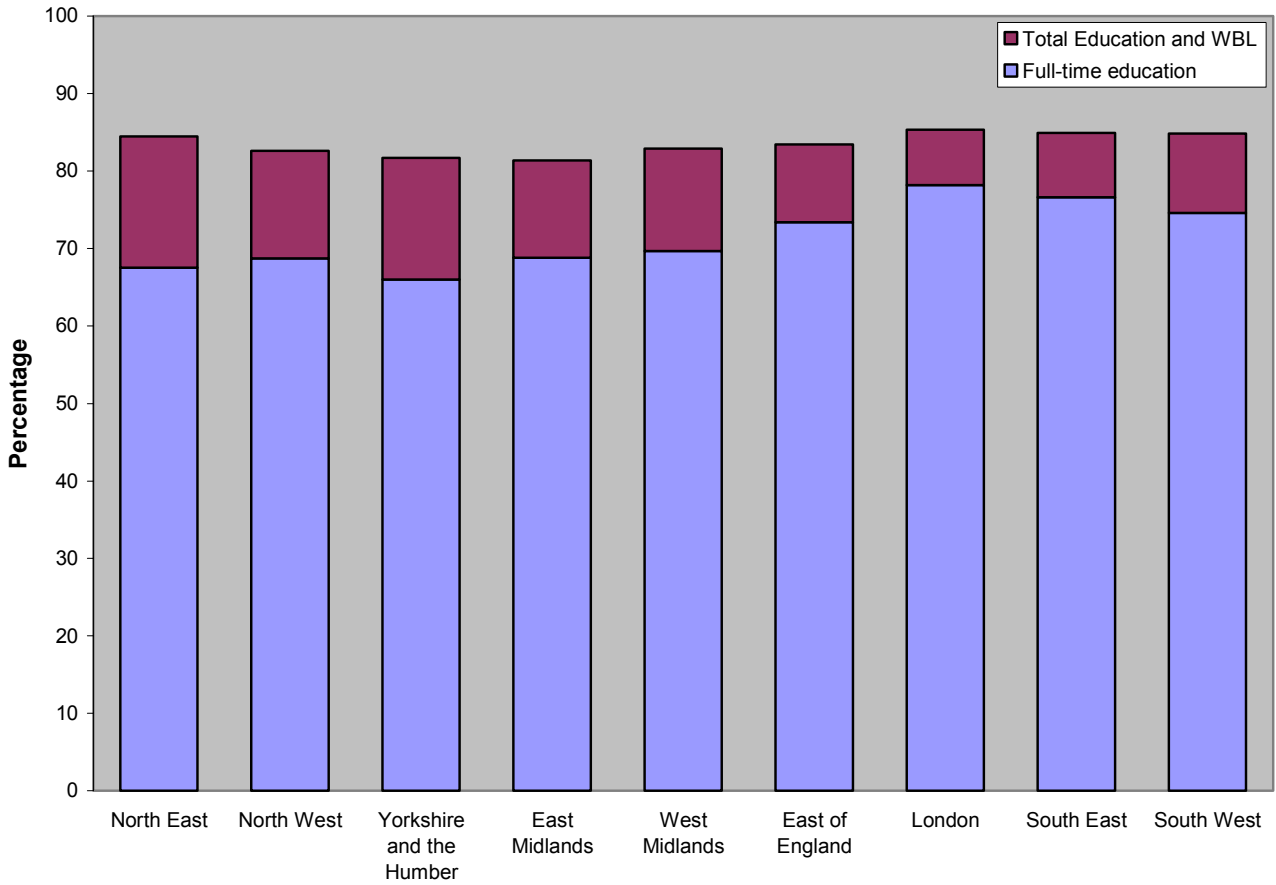


Chart B: Participation of 17 year olds in education and WBL by region, end 2003
